Student Health Services

La Casa Family Health Center is proud to provide health services to the students of Eastern New Mexico University. Campus based services include:

Acute care (sick visits): Evaluation and management of sore throats, rashes, coughs, or strains/sprains

Preventative care: Physical examinations, family planning, pregnancy tests, STD screening, TB testing

Wellness: Health risk assessment through medical history and lab testing, lifestyle management and education

Disease Management: Episodic care for and management of stable chronic conditions including asthma, obesity, hypertension, with referral to La Casa's main site for on-going care as needed

Prescriptions: La Casa will provide prescription medication under the federal 340B prescription drug program

Insurance Information: On-site screening for NM Health Insurance Exchange Program insurance plan enrollment.



All ENMU students are welcome to use the following services provided at La Casa Family Health Center just a few blocks from campus at 1515 W. Fir Portales, NM.

Primary Medical Care for the entire family, (including: family practice, obstetrics, gynecology, pediatrics and internal medicine).

Dental Services: general and cosmetic dentistry.

Promotora/Outreach: our Promotora/ Outreach workers educate and enroll eligible clients into Medicaid, Medicare and other programs. They provide preventative health promotion and family self sufficiency.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Program: the B&CC Program offers uninsured/ underinsured female patients over the age of 30 free screening for early detection of breast and cervical cancer.

Families First: a prenatal care coordination between nurse and expecting mother. Designed to improve the health status of pregnant women and their children. Referrals are made to outside agencies and resources such as WIC.

Medication Assistance: sharing the Care-Providing Pfizer's most advanced pharmaceutical products to the indigent population.

340B Program: provides medication to patients who may not otherwise be able to afford their prescriptions.

Fees for Services

Insured ENMU students will be required to present their insurance/Medicaid/Medicare card at the time of service. La Casa will file insurance claims for payment and co-pays are paid by ENMU.

Uninsured ENMU Students: La Casa will assist students in enrolling under an insurance plan for which they qualify for. Until the student is insured, they will not be charged for health services provided by La Casa at Student Health Services.

Sliding Fee Scale

La Casa offers a sliding fee scale to those who do not have insurance. The fee is based on income and household size and may be as little as \$20 per office visit.

La Casa will help uninsured students enroll in an insurance plan for which they qualify.
